All Programs use Evidence-Based or Evidence-Informed Practices

HFW* and ISST* Evidence-Based Programs



ISST

INDIVIDUALIZED Service and Support Team, a planning process that is youth- and family-focused, community-supported, and promotes collaboration and coordination among systems.

E-ISST

EXPEDITED ISSTs serve youth ages 10-17 with juvenile justice involvement.

T-ISST

TRUANT ISSTs are for youth with truancy charges or at-risk of truancy and identified/referred by school districts.

C-ISST

CHILD ISSTs are for youth ages 0-10. This early intervention ISST provides planning for youth identified in early childhood settings with behavioral concerns or through the courts with open Dependency and Neglect cases.

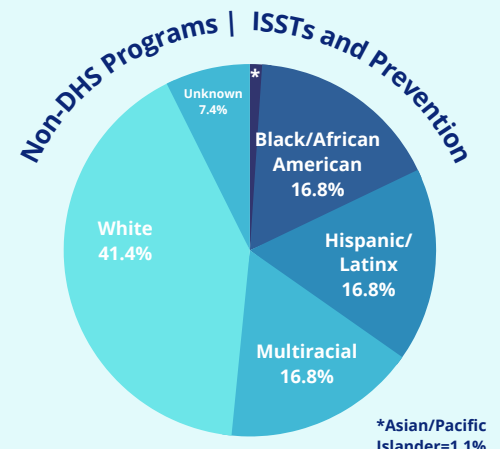
The IOG selected the domains of Child Welfare and Juvenile Justice. Education and Health/Mental domains were not selected.
