HEALTH + WELL-BEING PROJECT

Health & Well-Being aims to support and enhance healthy practices and social/emotional and behavioral support for community organizations and families.

UPDATES | EMBEDDED EARLY CHILDHOOD MENTAL HEALTH CONSULTATION (E-ECMHC):

- **Consultants supported teachers and directors** with children who presented with trauma and aggressive behavior, providing strategies for following directions, safe peer interactions and self-regulation. Families are being supported through deployments, fostering and parent divorce.
- A professional development (PD) class was held with 15 teachers in attendance. An additional six workshops have been planned for the upcoming months.
- A center that is not part of embedded programming reached is being supported with a handful of children that are at risk of expulsion.
- Most centers continue to struggle with staff shortages and staff retention. Consultants support directors as they navigate daily staffing changes and continue to build strong relationships with teachers as they experience stress and burnout.

FAMILY, FRIEND + NEIGHBOR (FFN) PROGRAMING: THE COLORADO HEALTH FOUNDATION

- Outreach: Outreach continues through attendance at community meetings, events, and virtual settings.
- **Playgroups:** Children and adults actively engaged in early literacy, music, movement, and art activities. Special guests included The Cheyenne Mountain Zoo, which hosted a variety of small animals, and the Rocky Mountain Prevention Research Center, which led the group through a cooking activity.
- An FFN, Michelle Klohe, was contracted out to assist with additional outreach and act as a program advisor.

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QUALITY INITIATIVES PROJECT INTEGRATED WITH PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Quality Initiatives (QI) focus on coaching, outreach, supports, resources/assets, and professional development to enhance quality in early care and education (ECE) programs. Child Care Resource & Referral (CCR&R) work focuses on outreach to update and support licensed ECE programs, increase capacity for licensed ECE programs, and provide resources and referrals for parents/families for ECE programs. Professional Development (PD) is integrated throughout QI and CCR&R.

QI UPDATES

- Child Care Resource and Referral
 - BridgeCare has launched the Pikes Peak Early Childhood **Provider Portal**.
 - This allows providers to update their desired openings in real time. This will also give families access to current openings and the Council access to community-wide supply an demand data. Once providers are using this information, the website will be shared with families. This is the website that families will be directed to, to apply for Universal Pre-K, so provider engagement is very important.

• Program Outreach

• A total of **five** early childhood providers are engaged with the QI Navigator to increase from a Level 1 to a Level 2 rating.

Colorado Shines Quality Improvement Grant

- We would like to get more programs in the queue for a rating, but Clayton is still catching up from COVID delays.
- Colorado Shines ratings will resume in person in January and will utilize the ERS-3 tools as well as a new Colorado Shines Point Structure. QI coaches will be supporting programs in learning these tools through mock observations and will review the new Point Structure when it is finalized to ensure rating readiness.
- Emerging + Expanding Child Care Grant
 New no programs receiving funds yet.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT UPDATES

- Workforce Development: November was the last Wages + Stages Leadership Program. Embracing Change-Letting Go of the Status QUO.
- **ECE Career Navigator supports** include career pathways, PDIS general support, Early Childhood Teacher qualification, scholarships, and Director qualification.
