


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PROGRAM PERFORMANCE MEASURES

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*Note: This does not include data regarding youth who may have aged out of DYS and were sent to prison.

ISST	INDIVIDUALIZED Service and Support Team, a planning process that is youth- and family-focused, community-supported, and promotes collaboration and coordination among systems.
E-ISST	EXPEDITED ISSTs serve youth ages 10-17 with juvenile justice involvement.
T-ISST	TRUANT ISSTs are for youth with truancy charges or at-risk of truancy and identified/referred by school districts.
C-ISST	CHILD ISSTs are for youth ages 0-10. This early intervention ISST provides planning for youth identified in early childhood settings with behavioral concerns or through the courts with open Dependency and Neglect cases.
