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WELCOME EARLY CARE AND EDUCATION PROFESSIONALS!

Our training catalog provides opportunities available in different formats:

PROFESSIONAL LEARNING COMMUNITIES

A Professional Learning Community is an extended learning opportunity to foster collaborative learning among colleagues within a particular work environment or field.

EXAMPLES:
Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs)

FACE-TO-FACE VIRTUAL TRAINING

Face-to-Face training is any form of instructional interaction that occurs "in person" and in real time between teachers and students or among colleagues and peers.

PDIS Face-to-Face Training registration occurs on the PDIS website; class is provided locally as a Face-to-Face training.

SERIES (EXTENDED LENGTH TRAINING)

Series training earns additional points toward the Early Childhood Professional Credential. 'Series' is defined as at least 12 hours of training delivered on more than one occasion at least one week apart.

JOB EMBEDDED TRAINING

Job Embedded (JE) training is when an individual participates in at least eight hours of coaching that is connected to a specific training.

Job Embedded Coaching can be applied to the majority of AFK training.

COMPETENCY DOMAINS

There are seven different content areas, or domains, in the Colorado Competencies for Early Childhood Educators and Professionals. These domains together describe the knowledge and skills that early childhood educators need to work effectively with children, birth through age eight, and their families. Continuing education, including college classes, professional development courses, and training events, help professionals to increase their knowledge and skills within the competencies. Throughout the competencies, there is an increased focus on cultural competence and inclusion of all children.

The seven domains in Colorado's Competencies for Early Childhood Educators and Professionals include:

- ◆ Child Growth, Development, and Learning (CGDL)
- ◆ Child Observation and Assessment (COA)
- ◆ Family and Community Partnerships (FCP)
- ◆ Social-Emotional Health and Development Promotion (SEHD)
- ◆ Health, Safety, and Nutrition (HSN)
- ◆ Professional Practice (PP)
- ◆ Teaching Practice (TP)

TRAINING FOR FAMILY CHILD CARE PROVIDERS

PRE-LICENSING

Pre-Licensing: Becoming a Licensed Family Child Care Provider is an exciting career move that offers you the opportunity to be at home with your own children and provide appropriate care and guidance for other children in your community. Licensed providers can earn income for their families while providing an invaluable service to the community.

TRAINING FOR ALL

EQIT SESSIONS A and B

EQIT Course Description: The 48-hour EQIT Curriculum provides a solid introduction to infant and toddler development, with a focus on providing quality group care for our youngest children. The EQIT course builds on the knowledge and experiences of infant and toddler caregivers through interesting, interactive and fun activities. The EQIT Curriculum has been approved by the Division of Child Care as one of the classes that can be used for Early Childhood Teacher (formerly Group Leader) Qualifications AND will count toward the Infant Toddler course required for Director Qualifications.

RESTORATIVE PRACTICE: PART OF A TRAUMA-INFORMED CLASSROOM STRATEGY

Joint Initiatives for Youth + Families is offering a NEW learning session presenting the connection between trauma-informed practices and the five principles of restorative practice (relationship, respect, responsibility, repair, and reintegration). Kathy Orr, Executive Director of Peaceful Households, will lead this learning session focused on understanding the role of trauma, building community in the classroom, and developing healthy relationships.

SOCIAL-EMOTIONAL HEALTH + DEVELOPMENT - TRAUMA 1 AND 2

Trauma 1: This training will go over promoting social-emotional development in a trauma-sensitive environment helping both teachers and students have a successful learning environment. This class will also help earn points toward the Colorado Shines rating. It is highly recommended to take this training before taking Trauma 2.

Trauma 2: This training is the second part of Trauma 1, and it is highly recommended that you take Trauma 1 before taking Trauma 2. This training goes more in-depth about the effects trauma has on the young brain and what you can do to help promote a trauma-sensitive classroom, both for adults and children. This class will also help earn points toward the Colorado Shines rating.

CHALLENGING BEHAVIOR IN CHILDREN

In a classroom environment, one of the biggest obstacles you may face is dealing with children with challenging behavior. Not only does the child affect you trying to teach a lesson and maintain control, but they also disrupt the productivity of the class as a whole. Children who display challenging behavior don't usually do so "just because they want to." There's often a reason behind their behavior, or it might be their only way of telling you something's wrong. All behavior is a form of communication. Therefore, it's essential that you understand the causes of challenging behavior and know what strategies will help you deal with it.

TRAINING FOR ALL

EARLY CHILDHOOD TRAUMA TRAINING FOR FAMILIES AND CAREGIVERS

This training is for families or anyone in the community who would like deeper knowledge of what childhood trauma looks like and how to promote a trauma-sensitive home environment. You will learn how to: 1) define trauma; 2) understand the developmental implications of early childhood trauma; 3) understand the prevalence of trauma; 4) identify the basic brain structures involved in the biological response to trauma; and 5) understand how toxic stress impacts the brain.

CLASS (CLASSROOM ASSESSMENT SCORING SYSTEM) TOOL OVERVIEW

CLASS not only defines teaching quality through the lens of interactions, but it also provides the ability to measure and improve the interactions that matter most for children's outcomes. And it's a journey of continuous improvement that is data-driven.




As you implement CLASS, you will:

- Focus on high-quality interactions and create a shared understanding of quality in your program.
- Measure the quality of interactions to create a system that enables data-driven improvement.
- Improve teaching quality through tailored and individualized professional development.

CHILDCAREREAD


The ChildcareRead 4-hour workshop provides certification for people who work directly with children birth-5 years old. In this training, participants will gain ideas and strategies to energize storytime, make reading fun, and expand literacy into other parts of the child care day. They will participate in sample lessons from the Story Exploring® curriculum and learn the step-by-step model for planning the use of books with young children. Participants will become certified as a Story Exploring® Facilitator Earn 4 hours in Colorado Shines PDIS; learn ways to meet high-quality child care and education standards in language and literacy; and receive the curriculum of over 60 lessons, parent take-home materials in English and Spanish, and several children's books, and more.

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PARTICIPANT REMOTE LEARNING + PROFESSIONAL BEHAVIOR GUIDELINES

Registration and payment for an event or training indicate your agreement to the guidelines below:

To support a positive, safe, and productive remote learning training environment for all in attendance, all participants are expected to follow the general *Participant Remote Learning & Professional Behavior Guidelines*. Participants who violate any of the following (1 – 7) will be removed from the training and may be prohibited from attending future training. These Guidelines include, but are not limited to:

1. **Disruptive Behavior:** Engaging in any disruptive behavior that negatively affects or impedes teaching or learning (regardless of the mode of delivery or class setting), or disrupts the general operation of training as well as any function authorized or supervised by trainers/vendors
2. **Narcotics/Alcohol:** Using and or being under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs while in training or any function authorized or supervised by trainers/vendors. Note: Although possession and use of marijuana consistent with the requirements of the Colorado Constitution is no longer a crime in the State of Colorado, the possession and use of marijuana remain illegal under federal law.
3. **Non-physical abuse** includes threats, intimidation, coercion, influence, or any unwelcome conduct in any form that is sufficiently severe, pervasive, or persistent that it alters the conditions of the learning environment.
4. **Knowingly falsifying, publishing, or distributing, in any form, material** that tends to impeach the honesty, integrity, virtue, or reputation of another person.
5. **Harassment and/or Discrimination:** Discrimination or harassment based on sex/gender, race, color, age, creed, national or ethnic origin, physical or mental disability, veteran status, pregnancy status, religion, or sexual orientation.
6. **Violation of Rules and Directives:** Failure to comply with the rules and directives of instructors acting within the scope of their duties, including those directives issued to ensure the safety and well-being of others and the learning environment for others.
7. **Unacceptable Use of Network or System:** Unacceptable uses of any trainer/vendor owned or operated equipment, network or system including, unauthorized downloading/uploading software and/or digital video or music; downloading/uploading, viewing or displaying pornographic content, or any other attempt to compromise network integrity.
8. **Communication and Collaboration:** Review any communications from your instructor and familiarize yourself with any updates to the course structure, syllabus, communication preferences, etc. Make a list of your questions not yet addressed.
 - I. Some courses may ask that you join a live Zoom or Microsoft Teams meeting. You can join these meetings using your smartphone, tablet, or laptop. See student tech how-to for guides and tutorials on using Zoom.
9. **Attendance:** To receive a certificate of completion for the training, participants must attend the full training.

FOUNDATIONS TRAINING/EVENT REFUND POLICY

Registration and payment for an event or training indicate your agreement to the policies below:

A FULL training/event refund will be provided for Foundations training under the following circumstances:

- The training participant provides a written refund request to Foundations no later than ten (10) business days prior to the first day of the training/event. Additionally, proof of registration must be provided along with this request.

A refund of HALF of the cost of the training/event will be provided for Foundations training under the following circumstances:

- The training participant provides a written refund request to Foundations no later than five (5) business days prior to the first day of the training/event. Additionally, proof of registration must be provided along with this request.

Please note the following regarding refunds for series training (have multiple meeting sessions):

- Due to the importance of the information covered on the **first day** of a course, participants who cannot attend will not be permitted to continue the course and are **NOT** eligible for a refund.
- To request a **FULL refund for a series training**, the training participant must provide a written refund request to Foundations no later than ten (10) business days **prior to the first day of the training/event series**. Additionally, proof of registration must be provided along with this request.
- Participants attending any portion of a series training are not eligible for refunds for subsequent sessions in the series.

Canceled Training/Events

If a training/event is canceled or postponed by Foundations for any reason, including inclement weather, registrants will be given the options below, and the choice must be made within one week of the canceled training/event through email to Foundations.

1. Cancellation of registration and full refund of the cost of the training/event.
2. Application of registration payment to a future training/event within three months of the date of the canceled training/event.
3. Transfer of payment to a future rescheduled training/event.

NO REFUND is provided if registrants do not show up for the scheduled training/event or cancel a registration less than five (5) business days in advance.

All refund requests must be in writing and either emailed, mailed, or hand-delivered. Phone requests will not be accepted.
