WHO IS JI?

JI's work centers on empowering individuals to advance a safe, healthy, and flourishing community by preventing, reducing, intervening, and solving the social problems when families have limited (or fragmented) access to thrive. JI leads the charge to bring over 60 different community organizations, local leaders, and government agencies to the table, working collaboratively to solve data-driven community issues embraced with an equity lens and collective impact focus.

Joint Initiatives for Youth + Families (JI) is an integrated network of community-based services and supports collectively serving the needs of children, youth, and their families from prenatal to 21 years of age. The three programs are Foundations, Pathways, and Voices.

Pathways commenced in 2017 with a focus on providing delinquent, truant, or municipal court-involved youth with a team of professionals assembled and designed to support the unique needs of the identified youth and their family. This multi-agency team approach creates customized plans to ensure each young person's success.

Foundations is the early childhood program of JI, bringing together agencies and individuals to work collaboratively on a seamless system of care for young children and their families in El Paso County. Alliance for Kids, El Paso County's Early Childhood Council, is housed under the Foundations program.

Voices commenced in 2021 with a focus on providing children, youth, and families with a network of supports to address their unique needs and ensure that their "voice" is heard when a family-drive plan is created. This program links children, youth, and families with these and other parenting/community resources. This program is also tasked with developing and implementing Restorative Justice (RJ) practices across the Pikes Peak region and implementing JI's Racial Equity Action Plan (REAP).

- Becoming a licensed Family Child Care Provider is a home-based business of providing appropriate care and guidance for children in your community, including your own children if you are a parent. This process takes time and planning, and Foundations staff are ready to help you get started!

QUALITY IMPROVEMENT COACHING

Quality Improvement (QI) coaching can be a key part of achieving your professional development goals as an early childhood educator. It is a safe space to reflect on your work and grow as a professional; focused on strengths you have and how to build on those; a place to talk about challenges you face in your workplace and brainstorm positive solutions; and can be personalized to your work environment, style of teaching, and areas of interest. Coaching is a way to earn points toward your professional credential in the Colorado Shines Professional Development Information System (PDIS) and earn point for your center.





PATHWAYS PROGRAM







In general, youth services through JI are focused youth (ages 10-17) in the Pikes Peak Region that have court involvement or are considered high risk for court involvement. Services vary and are individualized for each person engaged in our initiative. Examples include therapy, mentorship, prosocial activities, and crisis intervention.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Financial Assistance Forms are for professionals working with families that have youth between the ages of birth and 21 that have financial needs. The request should be filled out and emailed to the **assistance@jointinitiatives.org** email address with as much information as possible. Filling out the form is not a guarantee of approval, all requests go through a process to determine eligibility, sustainability, and the current budget available. Please include additional information in the body of the email to further explain the need and all the contact information for the professional making the request. Service providers may not fill out this form to request payment. Individuals seeking funding should be system engaged (youth in school, DHS involvement, juvenile municipal or district are all examples). This is not an emergency funding source; turnaround time can be as short as a few days or take as long as a few weeks. Approved financial support can only be paid to business/vendors and not directly to families/individuals.



INDIVIDUALIZED SERVICE AND SUPPORT TEAM (ISST)

ISST, Individual Service and Support Team is a process of bringing a youth and their team together along with community support and services to problem solve and create a goal-based plan for better outcomes lead by youth and family voice and choice. We offer two types of ISSTs, one for youth that are in detention or have juvenile charges and youth in truancy court. Professionals working with youth in need of a multidisciplinary team can complete the ISST Referral Form. The submission of this form is not a guarantee of services, all referrals will be reviewed for eligibility and facilitator availability.

CATHOLIC CHARITIES

Catholic Charities of Central Colorado offers emergency and temporary shelter/housing referrals, transitional housing, and long-terms housing referrals are made to a number of local partner agencies.



CHARITY'S HOPE

- Charity's Hope offers a supplemental rent and utility assistance program for persons unable to qualify for existing aid. This outreach endeavor is 100% funded through community donations and federal grants. Eligible members' utility provider, landlord, or mortgage company will receive direct payments from Charity's Hope. Processing times may vary and are dependent upon financial availability. Rent and utility assistance is provided on a first come first serve basis. 719.332.2360
- Our food pantry is open every Wednesday and Saturday from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm. All food items are free and distributed per family size to feed for four (4) days. You are welcome to come every day that we are in operation, and we accept food donations on those same days. **719.332.2360**
- The Clothing Pantry is open Wednesday and Saturday from 10:00 am 2:00 pm. Clothing for men, women, children, and infants is free. Clothing selection is seasonal and varies based on the donations. If you require professional attire for a job interview that is not available, a gift card to a retail affiliates may be requested. Gift card availability is not guaranteed and is provided on a firstcome, first-served basis.



ENERGY OUTREACH COLORADO

Energy Outreach Colorado (EOC) provides assistance for heating and electric providers other than Colorado Springs Utilities. Up to \$1000 toward heating and fuel costs, for up to two providers for a total of \$2000 per household per grant year (Oct. 1–Sept. 30th).







ENERGY RESOURCE CENTER

A nonprofit, Energy Resource Center's mission is to help income-qualified Colorado residents live their best life through energy-efficient home upgrades for healthier and happier homes. Qualifying homes include single-family, mobile, or multi-family. This includes rental properties with a qualified tenant and owner approval. **719.591.0772**



EL PASO COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES

El Paso County Department of Human Services administers the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits (formerly the Food Stamp Program). Low-Income Energy Assistance Program (LEAP) provides heating assistance. Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) provides cash assistance to low-income families with a dependent child in the home. Colorado Child Care Assistance Program (CCCAP) provides subsidies to low-income families for child care. View their handbook or visit their website for details, eligibility, phone numbers and descriptions of these and other public assistance programs available to eligible low-income individuals and families. Additional resources on their website include family medical (Health First Colorado/Medicaid), pregnant women's assistance, adult financial/medical information, long-term care programs, burial assistance, and non-emergent medical transportation.

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UNIVERSAL PRE-K

Universal Pre-K (UPK) is free and available to all Colorado families. UPK allows families to choose the right setting for their child, whether in a licensed community-based, school-based, or home-based preschool setting. Families of children in the year before they are eligible for kindergarten and qualifying 3-year-olds are able to apply for UPK for the 2023-24 school year. THE ARC PIKES PEAK REGION

The Arc Pikes Peak Region promotes and protects the human rights of people with intellectual and developmental disabilities and actively supports their full inclusion and participation in the communities of the Pikes Peak region, through education, a guardianship program, advocacy, and social events. In 2020, The Arc Pikes Peak Region will open an inclusive personal development center called Building for Change, featuring a teaching kitchen, library, computer lab, multi-purpose room, and more, for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families. They also ensure that students with disabilities receive the services and accommodations they need, and that parents know their rights in the Individualized Education Plan (IEP) process. Educational advocates work to de-mystify the Special Education process and assist your family in 504 and IEP meetings; help you understand your rights under the Individuals with Disabilities Act (IDEA) Laws; help you navigate education programs for your child with disabilities, from early intervention to transition; provide free, monthly parent workshops to explain the best methods and procedures to help your child; and create inclusive school environments through comprehensive IEPs.



CATHOLIC CHARITIES OF CENTRAL COLORADO

COURT-ORDERED AND APPROVED SERVICES



COURT APPOINTED SPECIAL ADVOCATES (CASA)

- CASA of the Pikes Peak Region is a nonprofit organization that trains and supervises volunteers to represent the best interests of victims of child abuse, neglect, and severe domestic conflict. CASA volunteers are appointed by judges to be a voice for these children in court and in the community. The desired result is that children be placed in safe, loving homes where they can thrive. Volunteers in CASA's **Dependency & Neglect (D&N) Program** advocate for children who are involved with the Department of Human Services and Family Court System because of abuse or neglect they have experienced at home. This is the program that most people think of when they hear "CASA" because the volunteers in this program are referred to as CASAs (Court Appointed Special Advocates). These CASAs gather information and make recommendations that help judges decide what is in the best interest of each individual child. At any given time, there are hundreds of children in the Pikes Peak Region who are waiting for a CASA of their own.
- Court-Ordered Supervised Exchanges and Supervised Parenting Time
 (SEPT): CASA's SEPT Program provides an environment where kids can develop
 and maintain relationships with non-custodial parents. By monitoring and
 documenting observations during court-ordered child-parent visits, SEPT
 volunteer supports individual safety, accountability, and healthy relationships
 between children and parents who are involved in conflictive custody or
 domestic violence cases. The program offers two services which take place at
 either our downtown Colorado Springs location or our Woodland Park
 location. Medicaid accepted and prices are based on income.



COURT-ORDERED AND APPROVED SERVICES



CASA | CONTINUED

- The Children and Families in Transition (CFIT) class is held once per month at the El Paso County Courthouse in Colorado Springs, or may be taken online. The class educates parents about the effects of divorce on children and how to reduce conflict to help their kids through the process in a proactive and positive manner. An attorney and mental health professional facilitate the class and offer guidance, insights and resources. The CFIT class is required for all divorcing parents and allocation of parental responsibility cases in El Paso and Teller counties in Colorado, with children under the age of 18, within 45 days of filing and before final orders can be set. Medicaid accepted and prices are based on income.
- The **Milton Foster Children's Fund (MFCF)** helps foster children where there are gaps in available funding, and also oversees The Hanger, a store where foster teens can shop for donated clothes and accessories, free of charge.


