### **HEALTH + WELL-BEING PROJECT**

**Health + Well-Being** aims to support and enhance healthy practices and social/emotional and behavioral support for community organizations and families.

### UPDATES | EARLY CHILDHOOD MENTAL HEALTH CONSULTATION (ECMH)

- **Programming at the six embedded ECMH sites ended June 30th**, and ECMH Practitioners assisted The Resource Exchange with community cases from their waitlist. A selection committee met this month to review 16 applications for four open embedded programming slots. Initial meetings with the finalists will take place the first week of August, with programming to begin in the 2nd week. Fifteen percent (15%) of ECMH practitioner's caseload will be community referrals.
- **Support was given to a homeless EC teacher at one of the sites.** She had lived in a shelter with her children for 3+ weeks and JI's Care Coordinators connected her with permanent housing and resources.
- The **El Paso County ECMH Collaborative** met once this month.

## FAMILY, FRIEND + NEIGHBOR (FFN) PROGRAMING | OUTREACH THE COLORADO HEALTH FOUNDATION

- Continued outreach at playgroups to encourage FFN participation in home visitation program. **Five FFNs engaged in one home visit this month** with one of them receiving 2 home visits.
- Thirteen (13) FFNs attended at least one playgroup.
- The number of playgroup attendees is holding strong with **an additional Family Child Care Home** this month.
- The **Early Literacy Program** offered by the Foundations FFN Specialist is being well received by FFNs. Providers and children enjoy participating in the early literacy activities.

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## **HEALTH + WELL-BEING PROJECT**

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#### TRAUMA-RESPONSIVE TRAINING + COACHING

The Foundations Trauma Coach + Trainer accepted an internal position at JI, and the **Foundations Mental Health Practitioner will be facilitating workshops from August-November 2024.** This month she familiarized herself with the training content.

### HEALTHY UNIVERSAL PRESCHOOL COLLABORATIVE



The **Healthy Universal Preschool Collaborative** is underway. Outreach was conducted to form a Co-Design Team which will direct how this Universal Preschool Program (UPP) screening project will look in our community. Thirteen (13) stakeholders will meet in mid-August, and initial recruitment of Child Care Health Consultants and UPP sites is encouraging. Jl's part-time FFN Specialist has accepted an Early Childhood Health Specialist position at JI to support this project in addition to her FFN work.

### QUALITY INITIATIVES PROJECT INTEGRATED WITH PD

Quality Initiatives (QI) focus on coaching, outreach, supports, resources/assets, and professional development to enhance quality in early care and education (ECE) programs. Child Care Resource & Referral (CCR&R) work focuses on outreach to update and support licensed ECE programs, increase capacity for licensed ECE programs, and provide resources and referrals for parents/families for ECE programs. Professional Development (PD) is integrated throughout QI and CCR&R.

### CHILD CARE RESOURCE + REFERRAL (CCR+R)

### EMERGING + EXPANDING (E+E) CHILD CARE GRANT APPLICATIONS

- A total of **29 applications** were submitted.
- Colorado Department of Early childhood has approved seven applications, totaling \$2,232,071.

### COLORADO CHILD CARE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (CCCAP)



- **One** provider signed a fiscal agreement.
- **One** provider is in the process of obtaining a fiscal agreement.
- **Two** providers are looking into getting a fiscal agreement.

### **ADDITIONAL HIGHLIGHTS**

**Expanding Quality for Existing Programs** and **Family Child Care Home Start-up** grant will be offered again for FY2024-2025.

This couple had come close to giving up on their desire to open their own FCCH due to a lack of direction and support they felt in the early stages of their journey.

### PD | ECE CAREER NAVIGATOR SUPPORTS

- JI's Career Navigator supports individuals in the areas of career pathways; Early Childhood Teacher qualification; Director qualification; Professional Development Information System (PDIS) ECE Credential and general technical support; Child Development Associate (CDA) assistance; scholarships; and UCCS Inclusive Early Childhood Education Apprenticeship Program career goals.
- Fourteen professionals were provided extra support with enrolling in PPSC classes and filling out their FAFSA.
- **Nine Spanish-only speakers were supported** to connect them with ECE resources and using the PDIS in Spanish.

### PD | PARTNER RECRUITER SUPPORTS

- Connected with high school students and supported them with resume writing
- Reviewed/submitted six Early Childhood Career Engagement Award applications.
- Learned the **PDIS** and supported the Career Navigator in helping those around the community set-up/update PDIS accounts.
- Researched high school pathways and is currently preparing for the back-to-school season, which brings opportunities to connect with high school students interested in the ECE field.

JI partners with **Pikes Peak State College** to offer funding, incentives, career navigation, and coaching to work in the field of Early Childhood Education.

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### **UNIVERSAL PRE-K (UPK) UPDATES**





### COLORADO UNIVERSAL PRESCHOOL PROGRAM (CUPP)

- JI continues to participate in an active group of LCOs to advocate for LCO funding. LCOs are partnering with the Colorado Department of Early Childhood to provide information to Governor Polis regarding the need for this funding, with the ultimate goal of a select group meeting with Gov. Polis directly.
- In Year One, the state's new preschool program was often referred to as Universal Pre-K (UPK). Moving forward, our information will reflect the state's new program name: Colorado Universal Preschool Program (CUPP or UPP)
- Areas of El Paso County with low availability to meet need: **D20**, **D49**, **D2** (D38 has smaller waitlists, and is not currently a high need area as it was last year, smaller waitlists. D49 is now based on waitlist numbers.)



- 73 school district-based (15 school districts total, all districts in El Paso County are participating)
- **39** Family child care teachers
- 88 Center-based programs
- **70** CCCAP programs









### **4,444 FAMILY APPLICATIONS**

484 are "in progress" but have not been submitted

The final algorithm for UPK ran in July, and the system is now **moving to a direct enrollment process** in which providers with open slots can directly enroll families interested in their program.



### 1,624 CONTACTS DURING JULY

Sixty-five percent **(65%) of contacts in July were with families**, the majority of whom needed technical assistance with their applications for Year Two.

## UPK RATES RELEASED

The UPK Rates were released on July 31st. The payment rates for El Paso County are as follows:

- Part-day: \$4806.51 (10 hours per week, 340 hours total)
- Half-day: \$6060.38 (15 hours per week, 540 hours total)
- 30 hours per week: \$10,762.40
