## CYDC | June

### June Bed Usage:

Allocation exceeded our cap for 30 of 30 days.

**Emergency Beds:** 16 used, with an average stay of **5.75 days**.

Flex Beds: 11 used, with an average stay of **3.1 days**.

Youth Profile: 22 youth identified as direct file or serious offenders.

#### **Allocation Update:**

The new monthly allocation remains at 30 beds, with **1 designated emergency bed at Zeb**. Emergency bed at Zeb must be utilized before accessing beds at PYC or other sites.

Emergency Bed Petitions (EBPs): No longer accepted.

### **Budget Update (New Fiscal Year):**

**CYDC:** \$1,708,406 — a decrease of \$4,745 from FY 2024–2025.

**MTR:** \$427,469 — an increase of \$20,296 from FY 2024–2025.

**Net Change:** \$15,511 increase overall, with a **possibility of receiving** 

additional funds mid-year.

## CYDC | July Bed Usage

### **July Bed Usage:**

- Allocation exceeded cap for 30 of 30 days.
- Never had less than 43 youth in detention, went up to 49 youth in detention at one point.

**Emergency Beds:** 33 used, with an average stay of **3.54 days**.

Flex Beds: N/A

Youth Profile: 20 youth identified as direct file or serious offenders.

## CYDC | July Allocations + Budget

### **Allocation Update:**

The new monthly allocation remains at 30 beds, with **1 designated emergency bed at Zeb**. Emergency bed at Zeb must be utilized before accessing beds at PYC or other sites.


- CYDC: \$248.78 under budget
- MTR: \$13,322.70 under budget

### **CYDC**

#### FY2024-25:

- We served about 300 clients, with 21 currently active. Our daily population averages 32 youth, staying just under a month on average.
- Admissions and releases stayed balanced throughout the year, though we saw spikes in August and June that pushed us above allocation. Length of stay has been less consistent—ranging from two weeks to over 50 days—showing some challenges with case processing and placement.
- Overall, detention use has been steady, but the data highlights the need to manage capacity and reduce longer stays.






### **ISST Activity – June 2025**

### **July Pathways Program Data**


- **ISSTs** conducted in July: 9 total, including 1 EISST
